Marriage is a lifelong partnership of the whole life of mutual and exclusive fidelity, established by mutual consent between a man and a woman, and ordered towards the good of the spouses and the procreation of offspring. As the Second Vatican Council reminds us, marriage is not a purely human institution: "the intimate partnership of life and the love which constitutes the married state has been established by the creator and endowed by him with its own proper laws....For God himself is the author of marriage."

This union, once validly entered and consummated, gives rise to a bond that cannot be dissolved by the will of the spouses. Marriage thus created is a faithful, privileged sphere of intimacy between the spouses that lasts until death.

Conjugal love, the love proper to marriage, is present in the commitment to the complete and total gift of self between husband and wife. Conjugal love establishes a unique communion of persons through the relationship of mutual self-giving and

opportunity to show us what and who we can be. God places a tug in all of us, and if He's calling you, He will continue to call and call. We simply need to never tire of our hope to seek Him, the patience to listen, and the courage to follow wherever that tug might lead."

Parish Financial News:

Hello again! In last week’s bulletin, we began our annual report to the parish about our financial status. We told you that the offertory is holding steady, the diocesan Rooted in Faith, Forward in Hope campaign payments are being deposited, and several large gifts were received from the estates of generous parishioners to whom I am forever grateful for remembering the parish in their wills.

The Parish Balance Sheet (to the right): Over the past five years I have tried to reduce ordinary operating expenditures to accomplish three things: payment of debt, funding repairs and building a six-month operating cash reserve. We wanted to direct about \$100,000 to each of these goals annually, which we’ve done, and then some. The savings has been accomplished by refinancing loans at lower rates, seeking property tax exemptions, rebidding service contracts and not replacing personnel in all areas of the parish and school.

The amount owed to debtors has been cut from \$600,000 to \$280,000. We owe the diocese about \$200,000 from my first year here, when the school outspent receipts by \$240,000. The parish owes its own cemetery perpetual maintenance fund \$87,000. We are happy to say, the loans on the duplex and the Millennial Campaign that built the Xavier Room, new kindergarten rooms and school office were paid off last year. Thankfully, the diocesan finance officers are allowing us to make modest payments on the remaining debt due to their awareness of the great need we have to fix our infrastructure.

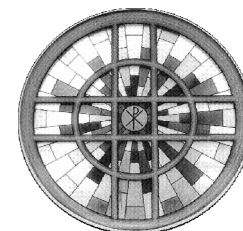

Now, for some more detail about the capital expenditures (on page 7) we had in our last fiscal year. The largest expenditure was a combination of payments for the final payment of the portion of the parking lot by the gymnasium (summer of 2013) and the first payments on the work done (summer 2014) on the south portion of the lot adjacent to the school, rectory and

church.

The second-largest expense was the phone system, which linked our buildings (school, rectory, church, church basement, Randel House, learning centers, classrooms and every meeting space). Many of these spaces previously did not have a phone. The new system eliminated an abundance of separate phone lines and is designed to reduce our monthly phone bill.

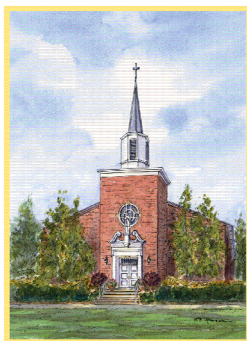
The flat roofs over the gymnasium and maintenance room were replaced and the roofs over the preschool and room 120 were treated with a White-Knight waterproof membrane system, which can buy another 15 years of roof life (plus 15 more years, if reapplied and properly maintained). This was done to forestall the much higher expense of replacing the entire roof, like we had to do this past summer above first-grade rooms 105 and 106, the hallway and the offices for PSR and assistant to the principal at a cost of about \$50,000.

The eight windows we replaced in rooms 202 and 206 were covered by a Rooted in Faith grant. The parish picked up the cost of replacing the old window A/C units with Mitsubishi split units in the three south-facing rooms (the hottest ones were 202, 204 and 206) upstairs as well as the three first-grade rooms that surround Mary's courtyard across from the parish office. These units, with variable speed, are very energy-efficient, quiet and easy to maintain. The other expenses included here are a mix of school and parish tables, chairs and desks.

So, "how are we doing?" people ask. Stay tuned. In next weekend's bulletin, we will look at the revenue side of things, taking into account the offertory collection, Christmas, Easter and other special gifts, as well as the Rooted in Faith, Forward in Hope campaign proceeds.
